Some Facts on Arizona's

SB 1070 (from the Arizona Legislature's web site)

- Requires a reasonable attempt to be made to determine the immigration status of a person during any legitimate contact made by an official or agency of the state or a county, city, town or political subdivision (political subdivision) if reasonable suspicion exists that the person is an alien who is unlawfully present in the U.S.
- Requires the person's immigration status to be verified with the federal government pursuant to federal law.
- Requires an alien unlawfully present in the U.S. who is convicted of a violation of state or local law to be transferred immediately to the custody of ICE or Customs and Border Protection, on discharge from imprisonment or assessment of any fine that is imposed.
- Allows a law enforcement agency to securely transport an alien who is unlawfully present

in the U.S. and who is in the agency's custody to:

- A. federal facility in this state or
- B. any other point of transfer into federal custody that is outside the jurisdiction of the law enforcement agency.
- Allows a law enforcement officer, without a warrant, to arrest a person if the officer has probable cause to believe that the person has committed any public offense that makes the person removable from the U.S.
- Prohibits officials or agencies of the state and political subdivisions from being prevented or restricted from sending, receiving or maintaining an individual's immigration status information or exchanging that information with any other governmental entity for the following official purposes:
 - A. determining eligibility for any public benefit, service or license provided by any federal, state, local or other political subdivision of this

- B. verifying any claim of residence or domicile if that verification is required under state law or a judicial order issued pursuant to a civil or criminal proceeding in the state;
- C. confirming a detainee's identity; and
- D. if the person is an alien, determining whether the person is in compliance with federal alien registration laws.
- Disallows officials or agencies of the state or political subdivisions from adopting or implementing policies that limit immigration enforcement to less than the full extent permitted by federal law, and allows a person to bring an action in superior court to challenge an official or agency that does so.

Thoughts on Illegal Immigration by Greg Valtierra

Right off the bat, let me state that I do not advocate people entering our country illegally. In fact I think most reasonable people, if allowed to think clearly on the subject, would see that no one wants to advocate illegal immigration, not even the illegal immigrants. The way the media discusses illegal immigration often portrays it as a cut and dried issue. Thus people are drawn to efforts to demonize illegal immigrants. Additionally, efforts to punish these immigrants more severely also become attractive.

However, unfortunately, illegal immigration is a more complex issue than what our sound-bite driven public forums can usually handle. It's true that some of the people who enter our country illegally are here for nefarious reasons. However, most of the undocumented immigrants are here for one primary reason, to make a better life for themselves and their families.

I can see examples in my own extended family. I am a first generation U.S. citizen. My parents immigrated legally to this country with my three eldest sisters and I and my two other sisters were born here in Los Angeles. Some of my cousins, however, did enter this country illegally but like many undocumented immigrants some of their immediate family members are U.S. citizens by birth. All of them have worked hard in the U.S., paid taxes, bought homes, and tried to realize the American Dream. Luckily for them they were able to take advantage of past amnesty efforts and are no longer illegal immigrants.

We must seek to address the issues of illegal immigration with compassion. We are not likely to find any silver bullet solutions but rather a considered series of policies and actions will be needed to solve the problems. Undocumented workers are easy prey for unscrupulous employers and criminal enterprises. We owe it to ourselves and to them to find a better solution than Arizona's in SB 1070. It won't be easy but it is possible.


