Be wary of paramilitaries: Our Club

has adopted a resolution opposing Culver City's purchase of a Bearcat for the police department.

Contribute to good causes: In joining together in Club activities, Snyder writes, "...we are creating civil society."

But the best reason of all to join our Club is the camaraderie! In this Club, I have met some of the most interesting, well informed, and fun people ever! Thanks for being my Club-mate!
